

KNOWN GERMAN IMMIGRATION EVENTS IN DR. JOHN V. RICHARDSON'S ANCESTORS

- 1) After 1708, Johann Frederick Stellwagen emigrated from Sprendlingen, Mainz-Bingen Rheinland-Pfalz, Germany to Philadelphia County, PA.
- 2) In 1728, Vincenz Stauffer (born in Steffisburg, Bern, Switzerland) emigrated from his hometown from Rotterdam on the ship, Mortonhouse, under Jn'o Coultas, Master via Deal in Kent, England to Philadelphia, PA.
- 3) In 1729, Anna Barbara Kiesel and her parents, John George and Christina Kiessel, emigrated from Ingelheim, Mainz-Bingen, Rheinland-Pfalz, Germany to Lancaster County, PA.
- 4) In 1736, Christian Landes emigrated from his hometown of Erzenhausen, Kaiserslautern, Rheinland-Pfalz, Germany on the ship Harle to York County, PA.
- 5) In 1740, Johann Nichol Haupt emigrated from his hometown in Windesheim, Bad Kreuznach, Rheinland-Pfalz, Germany aboard the ship Loyal Judith, captained by Lovell Painter which sailed from Rotterdam to Pennsylvania.
- 6) Before 1750, Jan Adam Schnell emigrated from Germany to Montgomery County, PA.
- 7) In 1752, Johann Jacob Steinbrenner/Stoneburner emigrated from Lachweiler, Schwäbisch Hall, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg, Germany via Rotterdam on the Saint Andrew to Philadelphia, PA.
- 8) In 1755, Philip Jacob Bär (or Bair) emigrated aboard The Neptune, under the command of Captain George Smith, from Rotterdam via Gosport, England to Pennsylvania.
- 9) Before 1764, Henry Pletcher emigrated from Germany to Lancaster County, PA.
- 10) Before 1765, Ana Eva Beck emigrated from her hometown in Ludwigsburg, Baden-Württemberg, Germany to Pikes Township, Berks County, Pennsylvania.
- 11) Before 1777, Anna Maria Schweiss, married to Johann Nicol Haupt, emigrated from Badenheim, Hessen, Germany to Bucks County, PA.
- 12) In 1833, Rosina Wollenschläger Weber, with her family, emigrated from Neunkirchen am Potzberg via Le Havre on The Tally-Ho to Baltimore, MD.
